Dear Parents and Carers,

OPENING SCHOOL MASS

Parents and friends are invited to join with the staff and students to celebrate our Opening School Mass next Friday13th February at 9.15am in the St Columba's Church. At this Mass our 2015 Grade 6 students will receive their school badges.

COMMISSIONING MASS

On Saturday 14th February the staff of St Columba's will be commissioned in the role as educators during the Parish Mass. Our School Captains Ella Weyers, Isaiah Britt & Vice Captains Anna Smart & Maddie Palmer will also be commissioned in their leadership roles and receive their Captains badges. Our House Captains Argyle (Blue) Cooper James & Eliza Smith, Iona (Gold) Alexander Pituch & Samara Stott, Clonard (Red) Joe Darbin & Hannah Sergeant & Donegal (Green) Olivia Paterson & Emma Taylor will also receive their badges. All families are welcome to attend.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES

School Assemblies will be held in the school's hall every second Wednesday afternoon starting at **2.40pm**. At assembly we pray together, share our learning, recognise and affirm achievements and share school news. Assembly normally runs for about 30 minutes. All parents, grandparents and friends are most welcome to attend. Our next Assembly will be held on Wednesday 18th February. Prep children are welcome to attend assembly with their parents on Wednesdays during Term 1.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP POINTS

In the morning students are able to enter the school grounds via the gates on Howard Street from 8.20am onwards. Until 8.35am, children are asked to sit on the seats outside the Art Room, where they will be supervised by the teacher on duty. The gates on Armstrong Street and the doors into the Columba Wing on Gregory Street will be opened at 8.35am. At 8.35am, children are able to enter their classrooms and organise themselves for the day ahead. The first bell will ring at 8.45am, with all children expected to be in classrooms ready to learn before 8.50am when the second bell will ring.

At the end of each day, students can leave the school via the gates on Howard Street, Armstrong Street or Gregory Street. Children must sit and wait to be picked up after school. It is not a time to be playing with sports equipment or on the playground. We ask that all children be picked up before 3.30pm. After this time, parents will need to enter the school via the office as gates will be locked.

We would also like to remind all parents to be especially careful when dropping off and picking up your children. Please **refrain from double parking** and take care when backing out of car spaces to ensure the safety of all children.

NEW TIMETABLE

This year we have introduced new bell times. The bell times are now as follows:

8.45	First bell
8.50	Second bell – all students must be in classes
10.50 – 11.20	First break
11.20-11.30	Students eat lunch in classrooms, supervised by their teachers
1.30-2.10	Second break (students eat their snacks out in the yard)
3.15	Dismissal

A reminder that ALL children need to bring to school a healthy snack (Munch 'n' Crunch), consisting of fruit, vegetable or cheese. Food needs to be in bite sized pieces for children to snack on during their morning learning time. Children will need to eat during the morning block as it is a long time between breakfast and when they eat lunch.

SPORT DAYS

Children will need to wear their sports uniform to school on the following days: Preps: LG13 Thursday, LG14 Tuesday YR1/2 Wednesday YR 3/4 Tuesday YR 5/6 Thursday

SCHOOL DIARY

Each child has received a school diary. We ask that this is used by parents and students as a way of communicating with the classroom teacher. Diaries will be checked on a daily basis and returned home. Parents, please encourage your child to use the diary to assist with their organisation and to return it to school every day.

PREPS REST DAY

A reminder that Wednesdays during Term One are Rest Days for the Prep students unless there is another non-school day in the week. Prep students will be required to attend school on Wed 11th March due to the Labour Day holiday on Monday 9th March.

FEES AND LEVIES 2015

Fee Statements will be sent home next week. The account will contain all fees and charges for the year (with the exception of keyboard fees which are charged termly).

We offer a number of payment methods (as outlined in documents sent to families in November of last year) to families including: cash, cheque, credit card payments, direct debit and you are able to set up EFT payments from your own online banking service. The school does **not** have an eftpos facility.

Existing fee balances from 2014 will carry forward to this year's fee statement. Families who foresee any difficulty in meeting payments should contact Kim Butler to discuss. We may be able to offer Family Fee Assistance support provided by the Catholic Education Office. However, we must receive notification of your circumstances before anything can be initiated.

Help your kids manage their asthma Checklist for Parents



<section-header></section-header>	Does your child have an up to date Asthma Action Plan (Asthma Care Plan)? The Asthma Care/Action Plan tells the school how to manage your child's asthma and what to do if their asthma gets worse. This should be updated & signed by the doctor on an annual basis.
	Does your child carry their reliever puffer and spacer with them at all times? Or is it readily available to their Carers? Medication needs to be available wherever your child may be (school, child care, sporting field, home)
A Star	Are you and your child aware of their asthma triggers? Do you take steps to avoid these triggers? Are the Teachers aware of these triggers?
	Do you listen to what your child says? They will be aware of their asthma symptoms and should be able to tell you when they need their medication.
	Does your child take their asthma medication correctly? Good technique allows more medication to get into the lungs where it is needed. Talk to your doctor or pharmacist if you would like to check your device technique.

We encourage you to download and explore. We will continue to build content. Please ensure you request 'push notifications'. We will be using this format to send important messages.

Instructions to download:

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type St Columba's Ballarat North in the search window.
- 3. If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "install".
- 4. If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will then be visible, click "Free" then "install".
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 - 5. When installed click "Open"
 - 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
 - 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".

8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

For Android users: You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device

2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.

- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.

5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device). 6. Click "Open" when installed.

7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".

8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

2. Our Facebook page will allow us to post information in real time, share celebrations and create an online community for those who can't always make it into the school grounds.

We recognise that not everyone uses Facebook, but following the positive experiences of other schools in our region we feel it's a great opportunity to share stories and communicate with each other in a new way.

To ensure that this page is an enjoyable place for all of our parents and community to visit and connect we ask that you respect our Facebook Page Guidelines which must be adhered to should you choose to participate.
- 2. Facebook users who have 'Liked' our page are able to comment on the school's posts and events and on comments by other users. Users are not able to author a post of their own or load media such as video or photos.
- 3. We do not endorse children under the Facebook age threshold of 13 years creating their own Facebook accounts. We encourage parents to share our page with their children through their accounts and to use our Facebook page as a role model for communication through social media.
- 4. We encourage you to provide feedback and comments however we ask you be respectful and contribute in a positive and constructive manner.
